

Home Composting Rebate Application

District of Columbia residents can earn a rebate with a maximum value of \$75 on a home composting system through the Department of Public Works' Home Composting Program. The exact amount of the rebate is determined by a sliding-scale. Rebate amount subject to change October 1 of each year.

Limit one rebate per household. See full terms and conditions on page 2.

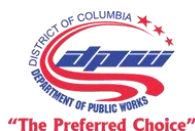

Home Composting Program Rebate Terms and Conditions

- 1) The applicant must be a District of Columbia resident.
- 2) The applicant must agree to the Full Terms and Conditions of the Home Composting Rebate Program.
- 3) Applicants are independently responsible for obtaining permission, prior to submission of application, from any homeowners, management companies and/or homeowner's associations, where applicable.
- 4) The applicant must complete this application form and send it, along with the relevant receipts from purchases and proof of residency document to:

- 5) Receipts must be dated after July 17, 2018, and include the vendor name and purchase price.
- 6) Proof of District of Columbia residency documents include driver license, utility bill, telephone bill, or other proof of resident accepted by the DMV <https://dmv.dc.gov/page/proof-current-district-columbia-residency>. The applicant's name and address must be listed on the proof of residency.
- 7) Taxes or delivery charges cannot be rebated as part of the total purchase price.
- 8) Only one (1) rebate per household.
- 9) The rebate amount will equal the cost of the system (not including tax and shipping costs) minus \$25, and will have a maximum value of \$75 to be applied toward the cost of a home composting system.
- 10) Rebates will be issued and mailed to the Name and Address on the application form.
- 11) Home-made composting systems, open/wire-only bins, digesters, electric "composters", and bokashi systems do not qualify. If you have questions about a qualifying bin, please email zero.waste@dc.gov.
- 12) Funding is limited and rebates are available on a first-come, first-served basis.
- 13) The bin must be used as specified in trainings, product instructions and data sheets.
- 14) The bin must comply with all stored and containerized rules and regulations specifically provided in Title 21 DCMR, Chapter 21.
- 15) The applicant may be contacted by DPW for research purposes on how their compost bin is performing.
